





PLAYWRIGHT BIO



JOHN PATRICK SHANLEY is from The Bronx. His plays include Prodigal Son, *Outside Mullingar* (2014 Tony Award® nomination for Best Play), *Danny and the Deep Blue Sea, Savage in Limbo, Italian-American Reconciliation, Welcome to the Moon, Four Dogs and a Bone, Dirty Story, Defiance, Beggars in the House of Plenty,* and *Brooklyn Laundry.* His theatrical work is performed extensively across the United States and around the world. For his play, *Doubt,* he received both the 2005 Tony Award® for Best Play and the Pulitzer Prize for Drama. In the arena of screenwriting, he has ten films to his credit, most recently *Wild Mountain Thyme,* with Emily Blunt, Jamie Dornan, and Christopher Walken. His film of *Doubt,* with Meryl Streep, Philip Seymour Hoffman, Amy Ad-

ams, and Viola Davis, which he also directed, was nominated for five Academy Awards, including Best Adapted Screenplay. For his script of *Moonstruck* he received both the Writers Guild of America Award and an Academy Award for Best Original Screenplay. In 2009, the Writers Guild of America awarded Mr. Shanley the Lifetime Achievement In Writing.

Notes from the Director

Sister James: Aren't the things that actually happen in life more worthy of interpretation than a made-up story?

Father Flynn: No. What actually happens in life is beyond interpretation. The truth makes for a bad sermon. It tends to be confusing and have no clear conclusion.

At first glance, *Doubt: A Parable* appears to be a play about religious institutions. In fact, in the old parable tradition (much like the dramatic tradition), the play tells a story about a Catholic school in order to tell a

story about institutions more broadly – about communities, about certainty and uncertainty and the thorny dark lands in between.

When *Doubt* premiered in 2004, the long-whispered abuses of children by the church were loudly making headlines. In 2024 we might think of different, or of sadly similar, corruptions. When the institutions fail to live up to their ideals, humans have to find different ways to be in good relation in community together. How do we – can we? – protect the most vulnerable while still offering "benefit of the doubt" to everyone?

In the first scene of the play, Father Flynn offers a parable with no resolution, setting us together on the journey of his flock. This play asks us to seek our own resolutions, and along the way to question our certainties, to question others' certainties, and to recognize the complexities of any "Truth." We may come from different starting points, and we may all leave the theater with different conclusions; yet as the parable reminds us, we are bonded by our questions, and by our willingness to keep working for our communities' good. How can we harness our doubts to drive that work?

DRAMATURG'S NOTE By Synth Manuel

ohn Patrick Shanley began writing *Doubt: A Parable* in 2003. The play was developed relatively quickly, as Shanley was deeply inspired and driven by the subject matter. It first opened on November 23, 2004 at the Manhattan Theatre Club, moving to Broadway on March 31, 2005. In 2008, a film adaptation was released with an exemplary cast including Meryl Streep, Philip Seymour, Amy Adams, and Viola Davis, all of whom received Academy Award nominations for their work. It received its Broadway revival in early 2024 at the Todd Haimes Theatre.

In interviews, Shanley has discussed how the idea for the play came to him rather suddenly and was motivated by his desire to explore the themes of uncertainty, morality, and authority. In the preface of the play, he discusses how certainty can provide comfort and stability, but it can also lead to stubbornness and close-mindedness. However, Shanley claims the concept of having doubt, while unsettling, fosters growth, questioning, and discovery.

Interpretations and discussions surrounding the play evolve over time based on societal changes, cultural shifts, and ongoing dialogues about faith, doubt, and authority.

Changes in the social and political climate, including discussions about power dynamics, identity, and social justice, intersect with the play's themes and resonate differently with contemporary audiences. The play takes place in 1964, the same year the Civil Rights Act was passed into law. How the characters grapple with these societal changes are completely different from audiences in 2005 (when the play was first produced), and certainly those



in 2024, who live in a world where same-sex marriage has been federally legal for almost a decade.

A year before Shanley started writing the play, *The Boston Globe* published an investigative report on clergy abuse within the Archdiocese of Boston. The Globe's Spotlight series uncovered widespread abuse and cover-ups, sparking national and international attention. The newspaper's investigation has had a profound impact, prompting other media outlets, law enforcement agencies, and survivor groups to further investigate and expose cases of clergy abuse across different dioceses and regions. (The Spotlight investigative series is the subject of a 2015 Academy Award winning film by the same name.)



In 2024, our contemporary world has united through the despair and doubts brought on by the COVID 19 pandemic. Communities in 2005 (especially those in New York City) were still dealing with the emotional fallout from the 9/11 attacks and subsequent war. It's safe to assume then that the characters in *Doubt* felt a similar bond as a population reeling from the assassination of John F. Kennedy. Global traumas like these influence our perspectives on authority, trust, and moral decision making.

While it's only been a little over two decades since this play was written, we live in a very different world than Shanley did when he wrote it. Our collective experiences allow for an even more nuanced perception of the play's themes of uncertainty, morality, and authority.

The Significance of a "Parable"

A simple, succinct story that illustrates a moral or spiritual lesson, Shanley has explained that the parable is central to understanding *Doubt's* thematic concerns. Typically, parables use human characters and everyday situations to convey deeper truths and ethical teachings.

The play is fundamentally about the nature of doubt, which Shanley sees as a crucial aspect of the human experience. By subtitling the play "A Parable," he underscores the moral and philosophical questions at its core.

The characters each represent different perspectives on the central conflict, but none are definitively right or wrong.

This moral ambiguity is intentional, and the parable format helps to frame the story as a moral exploration rather than a straightforward narrative. Shanley has noted that he wanted to create a story that reflects the complexity of truth and morality.

The play also examines the nature of authority, both in the Church and in general. The parable encourages viewers to question and reflect on the use of power and the dynamics of suspicion and trust. This exploration is made more potent by the parable format, which places the onus on the audience to interpret the moral implications.

SECOND ECUMENICAL COUNCIL

The Second Ecumenical Council of the Vatican, commonly known as Vatican II, took place from 1962 to 1965. It was a significant event in the history of the Catholic Church and had a profound impact on Catholic theology, liturgy, and practices.

Vatican II was convened by Pope John XXIII, who announced the council in 1959. The goal was to renew and update the Church in response to the changing modern world. The council addressed a wide range of theological, pastoral, and social issues, including the Church's relationship with other Christian denominations, liturgical reforms, religious freedom, and the role of the laity.

FURTHER READING

Vatican II brought a period of renewal and reform within the Catholic Church including changes to liturgical practices, increased emphasis on Scripture and lay participation, efforts to promote Christian unity and dialogue with other religions, and a greater focus on social justice and human rights. The legacy of Vatican II continues to shape the Catholic Church, theological discourse, pastoral practices, and the Church's engagement with contemporary issues. It is seen as a pivotal moment of updating and returning to sources within Catholicism.

The Order of the Sisters of Charity

Sisters Aloysius and James belong to the Order of the Sisters of Charity, a Roman Catholic congregation founded by Mother Seton in Emmitsburg, Maryland in 1809. Their guiding spirit is rooted in the teachings of St. Vincent de Paul and St.

Louise de Marillac, emphasizing service to those in need, especially the poor, sick, and vulnerable. Sisters of Charity serve in a wide range of ministries, including running schools, hospitals, nursing homes, orphanages, and social service agencies. They often work in partnership with other organizations and collaborate with laypeople and volunteers.

Dwindling Numbers

OF PRIESTS AND NUNS

The 1950s and 60s marked a significant period of change for the Catholic Church, including a noticeable decline in the amount of priests and nuns, for a number of reasons.

The post-World War II era saw rapid social changes, urbanization, and shifts in societal values, including

increased secularization. These changes influenced career choices and lifestyles, leading some who might have traditionally entered religious life to pursue other paths – particularly women, who now had greater opportunities for education, careers, and general autonomy.

The 1960s were a time of cultural and political upheaval, with movements for civil rights, social justice, and anti-war activism. These movements influenced attitudes toward institutional structures, including religious institutions.

Demographic changes, such as declining birth rates and changes in family structures, also had an impact. With fewer children being born into Catholic families, there were fewer potential candidates for religious vocations.
